New Updates (since last bulletin)

Outcome of the Advisory Board on 13th Dec

We have been informed by the DfE team who works with us that the Advisory Board have deferred approval of conversion of St Theresa's and Our Lady and St Joseph's schools. We understand that the board wanted greater assurance that some systems are fully embedded.

We are disappointed by the decision as the DfE team we work with is fully informed about and comfortable with our stage of development as a new CMAT. They were not expecting this decision from the board. We will be working with them team to revise timescales and have been assured that we continue to be fully supported in our development and growth as a CMAT.

I have of course already messaged St Theresa's and Our Lady and St Joseph's about this decision.



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For those schools who have started consultation or who plan to do so shortly, there is no reason to pause, or change target dates for transfer as we are hopeful that this is a change of immediate plan which, although frustrating, is not expected to affect longer term plans. I will of course keep everyone updated once we are able to revise timelines.
