Senior Leaders' Group

The Senior Leaders Group (formerly known as Deputies Group) met on Tuesday and I was delighted to be invited along.

During the meeting colleagues talked about the work that is going on through the subject leader networks. There was particular feedback about some practice sharing work going on between the Science leads, Geography Leads and History Leads. The Writing leads are also planning to get some cross school moderation in place, which addresses one of the areas of priority that came from the Heads' Forum. I will include details of that work in a future bulletin.

There was then some sharing of the way in which the quality of teaching is developed in each school. Out of that conversation the senior leaders agreed some follow up sessions looking at some areas that were of interest to everyone:

- A coaching model being used at St Wilfrid's
- Curriculum focus groups being developed at St John Fisher
- The use of Step Lab as a tool for teacher development at St Mary's

I am sure that colleagues will not mind me thanking Lynsie Tuplin for all her work with this group in her role as chair. As Lynsie moves on to take up her secondment as Head Teacher at Sacred Heart, the group discussed how they will work. I will be working with Lynsie and reaching out to other colleagues to see how we can support the work of this group. We will be looking to firm up a programme for the meetings through the remainder of the year, with some input drawn from the 'Aspiring Heads' Programme that used to run in the Diocese and a continuation of some of the practice sharing work that has been going on.

I will continue to highlight the work of this group through the bulletin so that you can ensure that senior leaders and subject leads can tap into these networks where it helps with your improvement priorities and with the support of those members of staff. We will also continue to liaise to make sure that the



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work of the senior leaders' group and Head's Forum is properly joined up.

<u>"Little Bits of God" artwork coming to the diocese – 10th Feb – 31st March 2023</u>

We're delighted to reveal that the Little Bits of God mosaic commissioned by the Bishops' Conference will be in St Peter in Chains Church in Doncaster from 10 February – 31 March 2023. This Mosaic, as well as being beautiful, is a way of engaging the stories in the Bible. It provides a focus for prayer and reflection on the Scriptures. We would like to encourage wide engagement across the diocese and we would particularly like to include schools, both in the visit but also in the planning stages. The mosaic will provide an educational focus on the Bible and Art as well as being a good Lenten prayer focus for both Primary and Secondary students. Additionally, for secondary students, it will provide an opportunity to see a mosaic close-up and explore the theme of symbolism which will be useful for those studying the Tree of Life Mosaic (Eduqas Route B) or other routes looking at religious art and imagery.

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<u>Heads' Forum – 22nd Nov at St Alban's</u>

Thank you to everyone who was able to attend Tuesday's meeting and for Lindsey for hosting us and for sharing some of the work that has been happening to transform the physical environment at St Alban's.

With last week's bulletin, I attached summary notes and actions from our discussion on SEND and a compilation of the notes shared by each discussion group. Thank you to Fiona for her work in guiding us through discussion.

The next step agreed is to take some further time to tie down a picture of what provision is like at the moment and what we want it to look like. This will lead to a pledge that we will sign up to. The overall aim is to focus on what we can control and to make informed decisions about what we can do in our individual schools, but also what we can do through collaborative work in the Trust that will make a difference.

The next meeting will be on 24th January at St Marie's, from 9.30-11am. Please do make sure that this is in your diary.

Conference Update
