Notes from Previous Bulletins

Christmas Fundraising Request – Bethlehem Care and Hospice Trust

I flagged this charity up as a cause we may be able to support across our family of schools this Advent. Thanks to those of you who have responded to say that you are already planning to do some fundraising for them this year, or have done so in the past.

I am proposing that we do support them as a family of schools, both to help maximise our fundraising and as an opportunity for our pupils to know they are doing something as part of a bigger family. I have noted below some options for ways that you could support:

- 1. You could have an own clothes day or simply include them as one of the charities you will raise money for through any activity you already have planned
- You could get involved with their 'festival of cribs' this might include a competition for pupils (and staff) to enter their crib &/or a display of cribs which you could invite parents to see
- 3. A combination of 1 & 2

I would suggest that we collect any money raised as part of a total from the family of schools so that pupils see that they are playing their part in work together. We could also have a trust wide 'crib competition' for any schools keen to take part.

Please let me know as soon as possible if your school will be involved in this work and, if so, whether you will be doing fund raising only or if you want to be part of the festival of cribs in some way too.
