RAAC

Thank you to everyone who has carried out further checks and responded to us with updates. We are updating the portal with your information today.

If you are one of the schools we asked for further information from and you haven't been back to Anita yet, please do get in touch as soon as you can. If you are having any difficulty with the request, please let us know so that we can plan with you.

We are in the process of commissioning condition improvement surveys for all schools in the Trust and we will priorities any schools where there are areas where they haven't been able to fully check for RAAC.

Statutory Audit Work – with Business Managers

Adnan and our finance team are currently busy with concluding the academy financial year and preparing for the statutory audit.

You are likely aware that they have already been in touch requesting information from Business Managers. There will be requests over the next couple of months to ensure that all elements needed for audit are in place. For the majority of schools in the Trust who were Single Academy Trusts, the reports and information requested should be familiar from your audits in the past.

I flag this up so you are aware that Business Managers will be involved with this work and to thank you in advance for timely responses. As always, if there are any challenges, please let us know as soon as possible and work with us to resolve them, so that the finance team know where we are with the work.

Christmas Fundraising Request – Bethlehem Care and Hospice Trust
