# Subject Leader Network Meeting

#### Data Dashboard

Anita will forward a link to the data dashboard that was shared at the head teachers forum. This captures the data that was provided in the headteacher reports (links will be sent only to schools in the Trust at this time as it is their data).

This is being shared to enable you to 'be curious' about the data, and to prompt professional dialogue.

To support with this <u>we will be making time available during the Head's Conference in November to look</u> <u>at this data together as a group</u>, with the people you might want to have a conversation with physically present in the same room.

This is the first time the Trust has collected data in this way and the dashboard is in its infancy. Therefore there may well be gremlins that still need ironing out. If you spot anything please let me know. Similarly, while we hope that all the data that was provided in the headteacher reports has been captured on the dashboard, we received some of the information in a variety of formats and it is possible that some has been missed in the transcription stage. Apologies if this is the case. For the spring headteacher report we will further clarify what we are asking for at the point of data collection so that we standardise this aspect of data collection.

I would really love to use this as an opportunity to help our pupils know that they are part of a bigger family and to see how their contribution goes along with others to make a big difference. To help with this, I have two things to ask:

- Please let me know how much money you have raised over Advent

I will put the photos together to share on our Trust Website and will also share them back with you so that, for example, you can share with pupils in school a wider view of what is going on across all schools and



how they are playing their part. I will also make sure that we can share a total raised across the Trust with all of you so that, again, we get that sense of the bigger family.

Finally, we are aware that there may be some sensitivity attached to fundraising connected to the Holy Land given all that is happening at the moment. I think it is important to reflect that the Care and Hospice Trust seek to give access to care to anyone who is nearing the end of life, regardless of creed, politics or any of the other things that divide people. Indeed, part of the motivation for the foundation of the Trust was to be able to provide practical love and care that is accessible because so often access to care is another of the things that is made more difficult by the conflict and divisions in the region.

#### The Big Ambition Survey – Request from the Children's Commissioner

You may have seen the Children's Commissioner recently launched '<u>The Big Ambition</u>' to hear directly from children and young people across the country about what they need to make their lives better.

This survey is for all children and young people aged 0 to 18. Children aged 6 to 18 can complete the survey themselves. For those who may need additional support or for children under six parents and other adults can complete the survey on their behalf.

We are asked to support pupils in our schools to take part in the survey, by promoting it in school and through social media and other channels. Where possible, it would be great if you are able to facilitate pupils completing the survey in school.
