Advent

Wellbeing and Health & Safety Information

We are beginning work around systems that help us to track staff wellbeing and health and safety across the Trust. This is about:

- Gathering information so that Directors, governors and school leaders can see the impact of work around staff wellbeing and Health and Safety
- Sharing practice and sharing the work across the Trust so that we help each other to do the best possible job in looking after staff

To help with this work, we need to collate a quick overview of what is happening at the moment. I am therefore asking you (or someone in school) to complete this short <u>Microsoft form</u> by Friday 17th Nov.

Please note that if you have carried out any survey around staff wellbeing (or Health and Safety) in the last year, we are also asking you to send a copy of the results of that survey (e.g. a report that was produced or any summary data that you put together) to Anita Bray.

School Data Collection

We are working with a company called MATPad to streamline and simplify the way we collect (and present) data from individual schools and at a Trust Level. We anticipate that we will be able to pre-populate a significant amount of the data that is needed for the Headteacher reports, as well as developing more useful ways of presenting and interrogating this data. John Coats will say a little more about this at the Headteacher Conference next week.

To maximise the chances of making some gains in time for the spring term Headteacher report, Steve Bunting will need to arrange a brief conversation (preferably by Weds 15th Nov) with whoever it is in your school who leads on your Management Information System. The conversation shouldn't take more than 15 minutes, and will allow us to provide MATPad with the information they need to pre-populate as much of the data as possible for you for the next reports.

Notes from Previous Bulletins

Help with governors – St Thomas More

This is a request for help for St Thomas More school, though I am mindful that this request may also be relevant to other schools in the family.



St Thomas More have recently had both their chair and vice chair step down unexpectedly for separate reasons unrelated to the school. This has left the school short of experience in governance while needing to fill two key roles.

I am reaching out to ask if anyone across our family can help. For example, you may have experienced governors with your school who may be prepared for a short period to serve on more than one board. Alternatively you may have members of staff or other contacts within your school community with experience of governance who may be willing to serve.

- Please let me know how much money you have raised over Advent

I will put the photos together to share on our Trust Website and will also share them back with you so that, for example, you can share with pupils in school a wider view of what is going on across all schools and how they are playing their part. I will also make sure that we can share a total raised across the Trust with all of you so that, again, we get that sense of the bigger family.

Finally, we are aware that there may be some sensitivity attached to fundraising connected to the Holy Land given all that is happening at the moment. I think it is important to reflect that the Care and Hospice Trust seek to give access to care to anyone who is nearing the end of life, regardless of creed, politics or any of the other things that divide people. Indeed, part of the motivation for the foundation of the Trust was to be able to provide practical love and care that is accessible because so often access to care is another of the things that is made more difficult by the conflict and divisions in the region.
