A final reminder about our annual Sheffield SCITT Headteacher/ITT Coordinator event.



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This is taking place on Friday 8th Dec, 10-12 at St Catherine's Primary School Sheffield.

We used to hold this event on an annual basis, but as with many things, this stopped during COVID.

We are resurrecting this, and are using next week's event as an opportunity to meet together as a partnership of schools to explore two important issues that will impact us all to a greater or lesser extent:

The recruitment challenges we are facing as a sector and what we can proactively do as a group of schools involved within ITT to help address this.

The changes to Initial Teacher Training that the DfE are mandating from September 2024. These changes affect all providers. We have been preparing for these changes for some time now and want to share with partnership schools more detailed plans for what these adaptions to our course will look like in practice. It is important that you have time to consider the implications (both the opportunities and challenges) and to ask any questions/provide feedback that helps develop our approach.

#### Writing Conference

Thank you for enabling your English leads to attend our half day conference on writing. On everyone's behalf, I really want to thank Claire Round, Lauren McKay and Jonathan Lear for planning and running the conference.

This was done in response to requests and questions that emerged from last year's writing moderation and I thought the quality of the input and the conversation it provoked was excellent. We have asked participants to respond to evaluation, which includes thinking about next steps as there were some themes that we can definitely do more on together. Themes that emerged included a need to be more accurate further down school in assessment of Greater depth, and work we could do collectively to help support that. There was also really good conversation about what really matters most at each stage in the writing curriculum and the potential for us to work more closely on this.



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Please do talk with your English leads about what they got from the conference and about the next steps that they would find helpful in supporting them in their work.
